DAILY ATTENDANCE

Because choir is a class where the grade is mostly dependent on in-class participation that cannot be made up, excellent attendance is the most accurate indicator of an individual and the groups success. **Students should not miss more than 5 days per quarter.** *Excessive absences/tardies may result in the student's dismissal from the ensemble.*

MATERIALS

All students should supply the following items by Friday, Sept. 5, 2014 (end of the 2nd week):

- 1. A 3-ring binder, max. 1 inch (any larger will not fit in storage cabinet) for all sheet music and assignments, paperwork, etc.)
- 2. Several pencils

RULES

There are only a few rules in the classroom. They are posted on the wall.

- 1. Give your best each day.
- 2. Cooperate and participate as a team.
- 3. Raise your hand to talk.
- 4. Practice proper rehearsal etiquette.
 - cell phone use, talking, gum, food, drinks, etc. are inappropriate
- 5. Be respectful to the room and others.

EXTRA REHEARSALS

In preparation for some performances and concerts, students in all choirs may have evening/after-school rehearsals as needed. These extra rehearsals will be on the calendar (see online at www.marinavocalmusic.com). Any extra rehearsals are mandatory and it is a part of the student's grade that they attend and participate.

PERFORMANCES

Performances are part of the choral curriculum and are **REQUIRED**. They are evaluations of what the students have learned. **In the event of illness or family emergency, please send a parent's email or call Mr. Graham immediately to excuse the absence.** A make-up essay will be required to replace the credit missed.

Formal Attire

The choir formal attire becomes the property of the student once it has been purchased and can be used every year they participate in choir at Marina. The same dress and tuxedo is used for all choirs at Marina (except Norseman). All students in Viking Choir, Valkyrie Ensemble, Concert Choir and Siren Chorus need to **buy or rent** their formal attire.

All students have the option of renting instead of purchasing (see Uniform Contract pg. 15).

Performance Attire Expectations

- Jewelry is not allowed with the exception of small stud earrings and a few small rings. Bracelets, necklaces or facial piercings are not allowed (including tongue rings).
- Hair **(women AND men)** No bows, headbands, or other large hair accessories. Women's hair should be half up, half down or all up. Bangs should not cover eyes and must be pinned back if too long. Hair must look "done" so that it will not move during the performance. Anything used to put their hair up should be the same color as the student's hair so that it is not visible to the audience.

Concert Choir & Viking Choir Men: Must wear black socks and a *plain* white under shirt (no logos or writing of any kind) when wearing their formal attire.

Alterations

An Affordable Option for alterations: One place that you can get the alterations completed at an affordable price is Peggy's Perfect Fit. Mention that you are a part of the Marina High School choirs. They have quoted us these prices - \$15 dress hem, \$5 tux pant hem.



Women: Please make arrangements to have your dress hemmed <u>immediately upon receipt.</u> The dress should be floor length (should touch the middle of the top of the foot in shoes) and requires that EACH LAYER be hemmed. A **surge stitch or a hand rolled narrow hem** is recommended for the chiffon layer. When being measured to have the dress hemmed, be sure to wear the shoes you will be wearing in the performance. **YOU ARE <u>NOT</u> ALLOWED TO MAKE ANY ALTERATIONS TO RENTED DRESSES.**

Men: Please make arrangements to have your tuxedo pants hemmed <u>immediately upon receipt.</u> When being measured to have the pants hemmed, be sure to wear the shoes you will be wearing in the performance. In *some* instances, it may be necessary to hem the sleeve length of the tux jacket if it is too long. **YOU ARE <u>NOT</u> ALLOWED TO MAKE ANY ALTERATIONS TO RENTED TUXEDOS.**

Concert Attire - Norseman Choir

Because matching formal attire is not required for this ensemble, it is important that the students still look professional and feel confident as a performer. Therefore, the following is required for all concerts and festivals.

Men: Black button-up dress shirt (collared, long sleeve), black dress pants, black dress shoes (not tennis shoes), black belt and black socks. Shirts must be tucked in. Mr. Graham will provide a blue bow tie.

Program Operating Expenses

In order to maintain a quality vocal music program, it is necessary to receive financial contributions each year to offset the many expenses incurred through general operations. The following is a summary of the amount that your student will cost the choir program this year. Making a payment towards your "Operating Expenses for Choir" allows the program to function. Please do your part by making a payment or fundraising to offset these expenses.

The Operating Expenses are applied towards:

- Festival, competition, and concert costs
- Sheet music purchases for each choir
- Group Voice Classes
- Piano Accompanist for daily rehearsals and performances

Fundraising and Student Accounts

Various fundraisers will be offered throughout the school year to assist the Marina Vocal Arts Booster Clubs general fund and student's individual accounts. Fundraised money will be held by the MVABC and a *percentage of the profits* MAY be applied to the student's account. **Refer to the chart below for percentage of profit details.**

Profits applied to individual student's accounts will reduce the amounts needed for operational expenses, choir attire expenses, transportation, festivals, honor choir fees, solo competition fees, retreat and tour costs. Student account money cannot be used for any other reason. If there are remaining funds in a student's account at the end of the year, it will carry forward to the next year. If a student will not be returning to choir (graduating, expulsion, transfer, etc.), any remaining funds are donated to the MVABC general fund. If a student needs to take a year off from choir due to their schedule being impacted, contact Mr. Graham about holding student account funds until the next school year. If the student has a younger sibling who will be in choir the following year, funds may be transferred to the sibling's account. Refunding or cashing out funds jeopardizes the not-for-profit status of the MVABC and is therefore, not allowed.

Concert Program Advertisements

We believe that this will be a wonderful way for families to pay for the requested contributions to choir this year. Many businesses advertise and have money set aside to do so. This is early in the school year but necessary to have enough time to format the concert programs. Programs will be printed in high quality greyscale (not color). We hope that you will get invested in this opportunity! **See form Vocal Music Program Advertisements in this packet for further details.**

The benefits that make the Program Advertisements extremely beneficial:

- Students receive 60% of the profit towards their individual accounts. The other 40% goes towards paying for the printing costs of the concert programs.
- The ad will be printed in 4 different concert programs (approximately 1500 people will view the ad) throughout the school year.

Segerstrom Center for the Arts - Group Tickets to Shows

This is a fundraiser that benefits the choir program while offering largely discounted group rate prices to shows at the Segerstrom Center for the Arts. Tickets must be claimed and paid for 6 weeks prior to the performance. At the 6 week deadline, tickets will be released back to the theater and no longer available to our group. The shows, dates and times that we will be reserving tickets are below. You will be notified by email when the tickets arrive and they will be distributed to the students. **All of Marina's group tickets seating is located at the rear of the Orchestra level.**

Private Lessons (Voice, Piano, Guitar)

It is highly recommended that ALL students study with a private voice teacher. For your convenience, we also offer private instructors for piano and guitar lessons. Nothing will help your student advance more as a young musician than working with a quality instructor! Students that spend time with a quality voice instructor more rapidly improve as singers and musicians. Mr. Graham's recommendation is for a 30 minute lesson, once a week. If this is not possible, a lesson every two weeks or an occasional voice lesson is still beneficial. Of course, the more lessons, the more benefit will be gained.

We have arranged a convenient system to aide in the students need for private lessons. We have several highly qualified instructors that teach lessons directly out of the Marina choir classroom. Our instructors are professionally trained and experienced performers in all genres of music including: classical, jazz, musical theater, pop and opera.

LOCATION: Choir Room 322

STUDENT COST: \$35 per 30 minute lesson

Voice Lesson Guidelines

- 1. Lesson times are to be coordinated between student/parent and the private instructor.
- 2. All lessons will begin and end ON TIME. Time will not be made up for tardy students.
- 3. **CANCELLATION POLICY**: A minimum of 24-hour notice to the private instructor is required for lesson cancellation by the student or parent. Any lesson cancelled with less than 24-hour notice will result in a **CANCELLATION FEE** in the amount of the lesson. Make-ups are at the discretion of the private instructor and are scheduled by the instructor and student/parent.
 - **EXCEPTIONS FOR CANCELLATION FEE**: Sickness on the day of the lesson with NOTIFICATION to the private instructor.
- 4. Payments are due AT THE TIME of each lesson (checks made out to Marina Vocal Arts Booster Club, not the teacher) and should be submitted directly to the private instructor. The private instructor is responsible for submitting the payment into Mr. Graham's box. No payment, no lesson.
